## Message from Mr Shore, Senior Vice Principal

Is darts a sport? A question that polarises views and has been much discussed in the Shore household recently. I like darts and my youngest son, Peter, "loves the darts". What fascinates me is that the players are able to do things that seem impossible. We watched the darts on Sunday and the commentator, Chris Mason, explained that darts was about muscle memory; it relied upon practise.

The ability vs practise debate is also one that attracts different views. In his book, "Bounce", Matthew Syed writes about a number of examples where what might be perceived as natural ability, he argues, is due

to hours and hours of practise. A good example of this is juggling. Give someone 3 eggs and asking them to juggle will likely result in an omelette.

However, with enough practise juggling becomes achievable. Whether someone is successful will depend upon how much they are willing to practise and, crucially, if they don't give up. The aim of the practise is to train the brain such that the action becomes autonomous and it looks to the observer that the juggler has natural ability. The reward is that at a later time the person can still juggle. Can the same be applied to school subjects? Yes.
