Message from Mr McGurran, Senior Vice Principal **Friday 13th October**

This month marks the 100th anniversary of the Third Battle of Ypres, or Passchendaele as it is otherwise known. It is considered one of the most brutal and decisive battles in World War One and played a large part in determining the outcome. It was in this battle Lance Corporal Charles Richards, a Kings Heath and former Stirchley resident who worked at the iron foundry in Lifford Lane, Kings Norton, was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for capturing a German machine gun with just his revolver. His actions helped the Allies make key advances in a battle that was notoriously bogged down in the mud of Flanders. He died, aged 34, six months before the end of the Great War.

The story of World War One contains hundreds of such heroic events. They are the accounts of ordinary men and women who, out of a sense of service to others, did

extraordinary things. It is right their efforts should be remembered one hundred years later.

While we cannot hope to repeat the heroism of Charles Richards, each year we endeavour to perform our own heroic works by our service to others less fortunate than ourselves. This week sees the launch of our annual Shoe Box and Sanctuary appeals. Bishop Challoner has a proud track record of being huge supporters to these charities and, while it requires a small sacrifice on the part of our students and families, the cumulative impact of our work is enormous. We ask pupils, staff, parents and the community in general to continue to support Bishop Challoner in this, our Year of Service, by supporting these charity events as much as possible so that we may continue to "give glory to God... by our service to others."

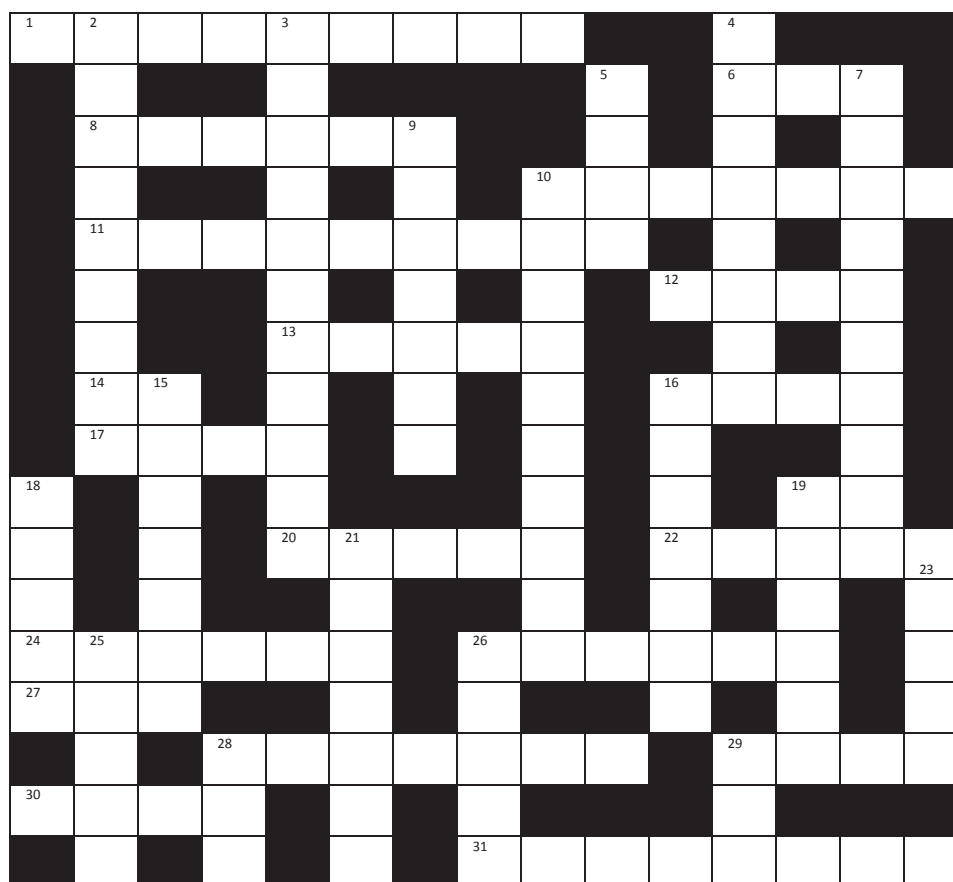
