Ambulances stacked outside A and E and corridors littered with trollies of patients in obvious discomfort represent significant daily challenges. Throughout the feature I was struck by the wholehearted commitment and compassion the doctors and nurses have for all those they treat and how dedicated and hardworking they all are despite the obvious difficulties they experience on a daily basis. The Missionary Society of St Columbus is inviting young people to enter a journalism competition, an initiative to mark their centenary year in 2018.

Students who are budding journalists, are asked to write an article or make a video report that informs, challenges and raises important issues on the topic:



'Migrants are our Neighbours'

The submission deadline is 8 February 2018.

The Missionary Society of St. Columbus has committed itself in a special way to accompany and defend the rights of migrants, and to address the underlying causes of migration. Young people are being asked to use their journalistic writing and mobile skills to look at a topical issue which is relevant to Catholic Social Teaching and resonates with Columban mission.

In Britain, the Columbans engage with immigrant communities and help to run Fatima House, a house of sanctuary in Birmingham for women asylum seekers, a collaborative partnership between the Archdiocese of Birmingham, Caritas Birmingham and Father Hudson's Care. Columbans have participated in 'Welcome the Stranger' Walks of Witness in London and Birmingham, and there is a long-standing ministry to domestic workers.
