Friday 9th March 2018

Sir Roger Bannister, who died recently aged 88, has been described by many as one of the greatest inspirational figures in British sport. He secured his place in sporting history on the 6 May 1954, when he became the first person to break the four-minute mile, achieving his goal in a time of three minutes 59.4 seconds. A feat once thought unachievable.



Our very own past student Dominick Cunningham will represent Great Britain and compete in the Gymnastics World Cup in Birmingham this month before flying to Australia to compete in the Commonwealth Games. Dominick has shown great resilience and determination over the years, winning medals at the commonwealth Youth Games, European Youth Olympics and the Australian Youth Olympics. Now on the world stage, Dominick will be looking to take on the very best to ensure he writes his own sporting legacy in the history books. We wish him every success.

Lord Sebastian Coe recently commented that 'His achievement transcended sport... a moment in history that lifted the hearts of millions and boosted morale in a world that was still at a low ebb after the war'. Bannister later went on to become a consultant and one of the world's leading neurologists which in itself is inspirational. Through his achievements, Bannister demonstrated that limits only exist in our minds.

As we edge closer towards the examination season, we remind our students to take inspiration and courage from such role models like Roger and Dominick. With passion and a positive desire to achieve, our students can prepare themselves to succeed in their examinations and build the foundations for greater things. Anything is possible.
